# Pulmonary Rehabilitation Program

## A comprehensive program to help people with lung disease lead healthier, more active lives

Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) is the third leading cause of death in the United States. The Pulmonary Rehabilitation Program at Rush Oak Park Hospital offers patients with COPD and other forms of lung disease, including patients who have developed lung disease post-COVID-19, the opportunity to increase their exercise capacity, improve their quality of life and potentially reduce hospital readmissions.

After an initial evaluation, patients begin a 10- to 18-week program, which meets two to three times a week. Individualized treatment plans include exercise, education, nutrition counseling and social resources. Each program component is essential to help patients understand their disease process while our staff works with them to boost their strength and endurance.

After completing the program, patients are provided with a personalized home exercise plan and are encouraged to continue to lead an active lifestyle.
