Moms On A Mission

Every year, COFI parent-leaders head to Illinois' capital to speak with legislators about policies to help support families and their young children across the state.





This year, COFI parent-leaders advocated for \$250,000 in new dollars for Smart Start Illinois, which includes:

- 5,000 more preschool slots
- Investment in enhancing and improving access to Early Intervention
- Expansion of the IDHS Home Visiting Program
- More funding for the Child Care Assistance Program

Parent leaders also fought for legislation that would **increase wages for early education and childcare workers** to a minimum of \$25/hour.

Start Early's Early Childhood Advocacy Day

On April 18, over 300 early childhood advocates, including parents and community leaders, traveled to Springfield to voice their support for Governor Pritzker's Smart Start Illinois Initiative.

Leading the charge were Start Early and their partners at **Community Organizing and Family** Issues (COFI), Illinois Action for Children, Child Care for All, Raising Illinois, SEIU, and We, the Village, who urged legislators to approve a 2024 budget that would invest new funding of \$320 million in Early Intervention services, evidence-based home visiting programs, increased childcare staff wages, and other supports and programming for families with young children.

Chicago Commons Workforce Collaborative awarded \$2 million for workforce and financial stability strategies aimed to help Women of Color



On March 15, Chicago Commons was awarded \$2.2 million by JPMorgan Chase to fund workforce development and wealth building initiatives for low-income women and single mothers of color. Chicago Commons and partner organizations Instituto del Progreso Latino, YWCA, and PODER, will invest in trauma-informed,

career-focused resources to help women of color overcome systemic barriers. Resources will include financial workshops, employment and health coaching, and mental health interventions. This initiative builds on Chicago Common's <u>Family Hub</u> program which promotes the wellbeing of families by providing educational, financial, and health resources.
